Update from the CE Dr Garth Bennie

Kia ora

Unbelievably the end of the year is bearing down on us and with no let up around the level of activity.



I have recently returned from an international conference in Vancouver: Claiming Full Citizenship: Self Determination, Personalisation and Individualised Funding. As well as the conference I took the opportunity to visit several agencies in the Vancouver area. The experience confirmed for me that New Zealand is certainly holding its own in terms of innovation, but like many countries is struggling to enrol the support of governments for more widespread implementation of new approaches that are clearly demonstrating better ways of providing supports and resources. I was also reminded about the centrality of person driven values and approaches as the starting point for effective implementation of personalised funding mechanisms.

The first substantive meeting of the working group set up for the **equal pay negotiations** was held on 29 October. Please <u>click here</u> to view the Key Messages, Negotiation Brief and Minutes from that meeting.

We will be sending out a **workforce survey** by the end of November. This time we are doing the survey in partnership with Te Pou as both organisations need similar information to inform our respective work programmes. This has the added benefit of providers not having to complete two surveys requiring similar information. The survey is large but we urge you to prioritise this because it will provide important data to support the wage negotiations. NZDSN will run a help desk function to assist people with the survey, information on this will be sent out with the survey.

Over the coming weeks we will be putting together the content and schedule for our **2016 Provider Development Programme**. We have now had two of the **three service design workshops that MSD agreed to host** to ensure a more collaborative effort with the sector to develop an improved outcomes framework and service specifications. So far this is progressing well with MSD having dropped the more contentious aspects of the original proposals. Our key messages have been: ensuring that changes are consistent with EGL principles; equitable access and universal eligibility – everyone gets a chance at employment no matter what the barriers are (real or perceived); an outcomes based payment system can only be implemented if the full cost of services is funded.
