Update from the CEDr Garth Bennie

Deloittes' Report

The work we commissioned from Deloittes was recently released to assist us in our ongoing work with government to improve funding levels and the approaches used for pricing and contracting. Click <u>HERE</u> to see the Deloittes report and <u>HERE</u> to see the associated media release. We briefed relevant Ministers and officials just prior to the report's release. We have since met with DSS officials to look at where to from here and have a follow up meeting in late January. We have a joint meeting with Ministers Genter and Sepuloni in late February 2019 to continue the dialogue that has already been happening.

It is clear to us that the cost of the pay equity legislation is creating some additional challenges in the context of addressing underlying funding shortfalls and cost pressures. However, the Deloittes report has highlighted the need for urgent attention and there is a good level of engagement from officials and Ministers around the issues.

We have made it very clear that our concerns around funding are not just about providers, but the very real risk that the increasing numbers of people with personal budgets will not have the purchasing power to secure the supports they need. This poses a risk to the aspirations and expectations of system transformation and its longer-term sustainability.

Thinking and Acting Differently for System Transformation

We are all being challenged to think differently (disabled people, families, providers and government) and how we need to change the way do things if the principles of Enabling Good Lives are to be translated into practice. At a recent NZDSN Network meeting in Auckland Lorna Sullivan (Director of the Connectors team with Mana Whaikaha in Mid-Central) gave an excellent overview of the changing environment and what it means for all participants in a transformed system. **CLICK HERE** to watch the video (with captioning).

Workforce Development

Earlier this year Careerforce commissioned NZDSN to produce a report on the disability workforce. This report highlights a number of areas needing some attention and provides a series of recommendations aimed at developing qualifications that are relevant, future focused and delivered to a consistent quality.

Careerforce are now in the process of recruiting a specialist Senior Disability Adviser and we are looking to partner with Careerforce on developing some approaches with employers, disabled people and families that ensure an appropriate workforce for the future. Mid Central Prototype Provider Capability Building Project

NZDSN is currently undertaking a project with providers in Mid Central to identify what is needed to develop capability in the prototype environment. We are now preparing a draft Plan which will be out for feedback with Mid Central providers in late January with a final Plan by the end of February. The Try, Learn and Adjust approach also applies to workforce

development and building provider capability so this is an opportunity to see what works with regards to these dimensions as part of system transformation.

Leadership Exchange Programme: 25 & 26 March 2019

We are very pleased to bring you our first Leadership Exchange event in March next year. The host organisation will be Tautoko Options based in Palmerston North. A leadership Exchange is a two-day intensive learning experience that provides the opportunity to immerse yourself in the details of an innovative programme or approach and to gain insight into the leadership dimensions that are sustaining it. There is also the opportunity to develop ongoing collaboration.

The programme is a domestic version of the Leadership Exchange programme offered by the International Initiative for Disability Leadership (IIDL) and is aimed at the rapid transfer of innovation. The intended audience are those in leadership roles or who are aspiring leaders. We encourage disabled people and family members to consider this opportunity. To ensure a valuable learning experience, registrations are limited to 16 people.

The focus of this Leadership Exchange is the "co-creation of a self-managing organisation."

There is no fee for this event and there is some funding to contribute to travel and accommodation expenses for disabled people and family members who are not supported by organisations.
