Cheryll is a life time volunteer, currently teaching handcrafts at her local Community House, volunteering at Waikaraka Park Speedway, and also learning Te Reo with Te Wananga o Aotearoa.

## Parking at Epsom Campus



### **Disabled Parking: Gate 3**

Parking spots in front of the main building: Designated disabled parking + parallel parking marked by cones on the day. Auditorium is on the other side of the green, behind where I am standing taking the photo.

### **Auditorium:**

First building on the right using Gate 3



### **Able Parking: Gate 2**

Option 1 (no stairs): Take path from the Gate 2 parking lot level 2 that leads up to this brown building, make a left to walk down this path of trees, and at the end of the path turn left to walk a bit to the auditorium.



Option 2 (shorter, but with stairs): Walk up these stairs from the Gate 2 parking and the auditorium will be on your right.
