A message from our CEO

We now have answers to two of the great imponderables of life: we know we have a National-led coalition government to look forward to over the next three years; and we know the All Blacks made the final of the 2023 Rugby World Cup!

While we await the final shape of the new Government and who the incoming Minister for Disability Issues might be, at NZDSN we work on the "BIM" or Briefing for Incoming Minister. This document outlines the state of the sector as we see it, the significant issues we are facing, what needs to happen to address those issues and our priorities for the year.

The problem areas we face are doggedly consistent: funding woes, for some - workforce shortage woes, accessibility issues, housing and accommodation issues, what the rollout of EGL will look like and how this may impact on providers and existing clients alike, Whaikaha's deinstitutionalisation project "My Home, My Choice" and the of their transformation remainder programme.

So, we see that irrespective of the shade of the new government, life goes on. From my desk, pay equity continues to be the gift that keeps on giving!

I presented last week at the Health, Aged and Disability Care Workforce Leaders Forum. While very healthfocused, the event did present an opportunity to reiterate our view that an overall Disability Workforce Strategy is very much needed, to give funders and the sector a view of the future and how we want to get there.

I had the opportunity to explore some on-line tools to collect data from the sector and report back to providers' benchmarks of how they are tracking against key areas.

Last Friday I also had the opportunity to host a meeting on health and safety concerns and how these might be addressed.

Looking ahead, we are slowly building up momentum on our own review of Employment Support services to support the re-contracting cycle led by MSD next year. I am also looking forward to catching up with a number of our provider members over the next week or two, supporting them to resolve issues they face where we can.

Other News

Next Auckland Regional Network (ARN) meeting is on Wed 15th November from 9.30am to 12.30pm held at CCS Disability Action Royal Oak. Early networking at 9am. It is a Strategy 2024 Workshop facilitated by the APEC Team (Auckland Providers EGL Capability Team). We have sent out an invitation and survey to determine what our collective priorities are for 2024, to tailor the workshop to key focus areas where we will ask, "What can we do as a Collective that we can't do alone?" Peter will be delivering the Opening and Closing Remarks based on those focus areas and join the table discussions. **Register early**, limited seating.

The APEC Team are continuing to work together to grow our capability, capacity, confidence and collective voice as Providers in Auckland since May 2023. We are at the grassroots seed stage and strategizing for 2024. The APEC Team will be co-facilitating the workshop at our ARN meeting on the 15th Nov.

Auckland Disability Volunteer Advisory Team has been initiated after the Volunteer Development Workshop at our last ARN Meeting in Sept. We have about 10 organisations who have joined, including leaders from I. Lead and A Supported Life. They will be coming together to collaborate with Cheryl Martin, QSO, from Volunteering Auckland on 22nd November, 2023.

Auckland Employment Support Network have started meeting again. Ideas were shared and concerns expressed. A couple initiatives will be followed up including supporting the National Employment Support Advisory Group that will include an MSD Contract Review. There was also an interest to focus on 'customised roles' for the collective in the new year
